DOWNTOWN AMBASSADOR PROGRAM ADDS OUTREACH COORDINATOR

The Downtown Ambassador program expanded in October with the addition of a Homeless Outreach Coordinator. With a background in social service and passion for helping others, Olivia Shinall fills the new full-time position.

Olivia acts as a conduit to services and a familiar point of contact for those in need. Like the rest of the Ambassador team, most of Olivia's work will take place on the streets of Downtown. Her efforts will be focused on building relationships with homeless individuals to provide strategic case-level management, directing them to the services or housing they



need. The goal is to gain trust, identify issues, and help people transition from their current situations into better ones.

During her first month, Olivia logged 104 homeless outreach actions and 68 contacts with panhandlers.

"This is just the beginning and I have to lay the foundation," Olivia shared, "It's all about building relationships and understanding each individual. Gaining trust is the most important thing because people will start to open up and tell you their story. If you know their story, you can better know how to help them."

Block by Block, the PID's Ambassador service provider, manages Ambasssador programs in more than 100 other districts nationwide.

John Koch, Regional Vice President of Block by Block, explained that this role requires persistence and time. "Our outreach workers across the country are a very committed group of people that devote many hard hours of work every day to connect with, and help, our homeless population. When I think of the people we help, the families we reconnect, and the lives we assist in changing, it makes the long hours so worth it."

With the addition of the Outreach Coordinator, the rest of the Ambassador team is able to devote more time discouraging poor behavior, providing hospitality services including safety escorts, restaurant recommendations, directions, parking information and more.

Toro Toro Pan Latin Steakhouse and Lounge – This new restaurant inside the Worthington Renaissance Hotel at 200 Main Street is a part of the hotel's recent \$8 million remodel. Conceived by Chef Richard Sandoval, Toro Toro celebrates Latin American gastronomic culture, integrating fresh ingredients with techniques and flavors of the two richest cuisines in Latin America: Mexican and Peruvian.

Ziva Nail Lounge – This new salon in Sundance Square offers manicures, pedicures, eyelash extensions, facials, massages, and more in their three-story shop at 408 Houston St.

FWDNA RAISES FUNDS FOR THE YMCA PLAYGROUND



This holiday season, the Fort Worth Downtown Neighborhood Alliance (FWDNA) partnered with the Amon G. Carter, Jr. Downtown YMCA to raise funds to support playground improvements at their childcare center. Each year, the Downtown YMCA serves over 300 children, ages six weeks to five years, between the two preschools and summer day camp programs.

The FWDNA recognizes that a key component of child development occurs through play, interacting with others, and experiencing nature. This group of Downtown residents is helping to raise \$40,000 to provide a high quality play experience for these children. This fundraising goal provides the replacement of wood chips with a softer, rubberized flooring, a safer playground structure, and an improved shade structure to increase protection from the sun and rain.

The FWDNA raised over a quarter of that goal over the past two months, with a special thanks to one generous Downtown resident providing a \$10,000 donation in November.




FREE SERVICE ON THE DASH CONTINUES THROUGH DECEMBER

Ride The Dash for free through December 31! The route operates between Downtown Fort Worth, the Seventh Street corridor, Crockett Row, the Cultural District and the newly- opened Dickies Arena. Since service began on Sept. 22, more than 6,500 passengers have ridden the new electric bus service.

CITY SEEKING FEEDBACK ON REDEVELOPMENT OF MUNICIPAL PROPERTIES

City of Fort Worth staff are in the early stages of collecting feedback regarding the use of their Downtown municipal spaces. The City owns 11 Downtown properties and leases additional office space. The City is considering selling property, including the Fort Worth Central Library, and consolidating the library and City Hall into a new, modern building between Lancaster Avenue and Texas Street. The work would be part of a possible 2022 bond package. Plans to continue revamping the Fort Worth Convention Center are also underway. LAMAR STREET TWO-WAY CONVERSION PROJECT

PUBLIC MEETING JANUARY 15, 2020, 5:30 PM CENTRAL LIBRARY (500 W 3RD STREET)

On January 15, 2020 at 5:30 pm, the City of Fort Worth will host a public meeting at the Central Library for the Lamar Street Two-Way Conversion Project.

In March 2020, the new Hemphill Lamar tunnel is anticipated to open, connecting Downtown and the Near Southside. Currently, Lamar St. directs traffic one-way from 5th St. to Texas St. Converting this to a two-way street would allow for better connectivity into the core of Downtown. The project is anticipated to execute in two phases. Phase 1 would be signal and restriping. Phase 2 would include resurfacing and ADA sidewalk ramps.
